# Ship Wrecks in

Colombo Area















Location – Unknown Depth – 40 M Sunk Date – Unknown

#### Note :

A medium sized wreck with a single boiler covered with beautiful black coral. Recommended for technical divers.





## **Toilet Barge**

Location – 14 km from Dehiwala Depth – 32 M Sunk Date – Unknown



#### Note :

An age of steam ship off the shores of Colombo. A small dive site but a ship with great marine life and an unusual feature that gives it its name - a toilet!





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## Lotus Barge

Location – Colombo Depth – 40 M Sunk Date – Unknown Note : A small barge resplendent with marine life. Similar to the Toilet Barge











## **Cardinal Barge**

Location – Mount Lavinia Depth – 29 M Sunk Date – Unknown

#### Note :



A small wreck, in a bad state but with reasonably good marine life, namely Cardinal fish and Snappers. Not really worth diving if you are diving off Mount Lavinia, South of Colombo















Location – Mount Lavinia Depth – 29 M Sunk Date – Unknown

#### Note :

The wreck on which world famous Science Fiction writer Arthur C. Clarke conducted his last SCUBA dive at the age of 74 in March 1992.











## **Thermopylae Sierra**

Location – 3.5km from Angulana Depth – 23 M Sunk Date – 23<sup>rd</sup> August 2012











#### Note :

The Cypriot owned Wreck Thermopylae Sierra was parked at the Colombo outer anchorage for more than 3 years as a result of a wage dispute between the owners, workers and the Sri Lankan Ports. Neglect took its toll and finally, on the 23rd of August 2012 it sank before our very eyes. One and a half years later we return to the ship and enjoy a fantastic dive to a unique ship wreck that is trapped between two worlds...





## **Taprobane North Wreck**

Location – Colombo Depth – 40M Sunk Date – 1917



#### Note :

A massive ship, intact and lying on pristine sand. A haven for shoals of fish and a place of pristine wilderness and 30M+ Visibility! We suspect this to be the British Armed Merchant Perseus sunk off Colombo in 1917 by a German Mine Layer. Investigations underway to ascertain this ships identity.





















## **Taprobane North Barge**



Location – Colombo Depth – 40M Sunk Date – Unknown





























Note : Technical Decompression Dive. We The ship is badly www.DiveSriLanka.com

broken but marine life is simply amazing. DiveSriLanka.com has now identified this to be the World War I sea mine casualty the British Armed Merchant Ship SS Worcestershire sunk in 1917!

Location – 15 km from Dehiwala Depth – 57M Sunk Date – 16<sup>th</sup> February 1917





















## **Chief Dragon - The Colombo Car Wreck**

Location – 17 km from Dehiwala Depth – 34.5M Sunk Date – 18<sup>th</sup> March 1983



**Note :** The Colombo Car Wreck is now in divable again! Just 4 KM off the city of Colombo this is a superb wreck to dive and explore. A very large area of wreckage provides a haven for shoaling fish and big Groupers. The caves of sorts at stern is a place to be! DiveSrilanka.com has now identified this to be the Honda Heavy Industries built vehicle carrier MV Chief Dragon.













## **Taprobane East Wreck**





Location – Colombo Depth – 32M Sunk Date – Unknown

Note : In the pristine far off shore reefs of Taprobane the visibility is over 20M on average. Here in an Caribbean like setting we have our Heaven on Earth. A picturesque ship wreck that is a must dive.













## **Battery barge**





Location – Colombo Depth – 32M Sunk Date – Unknown

#### Note :

A deep oasis full of fish life and colorful corals. its generally too deep for a proper single tank dive so is a favorite for Technical Divers.















Location – Colombo Depth – 30M Sunk Date – Unknown



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#### Note :

This ship was made accessible for divers in 2011. Surprisingly good marine life for a ship that just sunk. Proves a invaluable point that shipwrecks can soon turn to reefs even few years after sinking. Highlight of the dive is to explore the earth moving Backhoe on the deck. Another can be found under the decks. Excellent place for Lionfish.









## **Pecheur Breton Cargo Wreck**

Location – Colombo Depth – 33M Sunk Date – 1993











Note : A huge intact cargo ship which was sunk recently. Identity yet to be discovered but supposedly an Indian steel carrier that sunk in 1993. The ship lies on its starboard side and provides a huge area for exploration.

DiveSriLanka.com has now identified this to be the Pecheur Breton.





## Nilgiri Trug







Location – 7.5 km from Mount Lavinia Depth – 33M Sunk Date – 1997

Note :

A huge sunken barge that rests up side down. All the action is at 30M and the site is full of Lion Fish who are easy to approach. In addition various other marine life such as small Groupers, Puffer-fish, Trevally and Stingrays can be seen















## **Delhi Coal Wreck**

Location – 9 km from Mount Lavinia Depth – 26M Sunk Date – Unknown







Note : The ship is broken into two parts and lie about 20m/30m to each other. Can find schools of Snappers and Blue Spotted Stingrays in the sand. A bunch of over enthusiastic Cleaner Wrasses can be quite annoying sometimes specially if you hadn't had a bath for a while.





## **MV Astoria**

Location – 12 km from Dehiwala Depth – 24 M Sunk Date – 25<sup>th</sup> September 1997









#### Note :

Special permission is needed to dive this wreck which sank off very close to the Colombo Harbor in 1997







## **Gun Boat - bridge**



Location – Moratuwa Depth – 14 M Sunk Date – 10<sup>th</sup> January 2016



Note : A brief sonar scan reveals a strong signature in surprisingly shallow depths. The water is so clear that I snorkel over the point and am surprised to see a small but fully intact wreck. Diving in we are surprised to find a beautiful dive site. Along a rocky reef rests, what appears to be a, navy gun boat / patrol craft. At 14 m depth this is a great dive site for divers all levels.
